### Ty Golchi from the east (Haverfordwest)

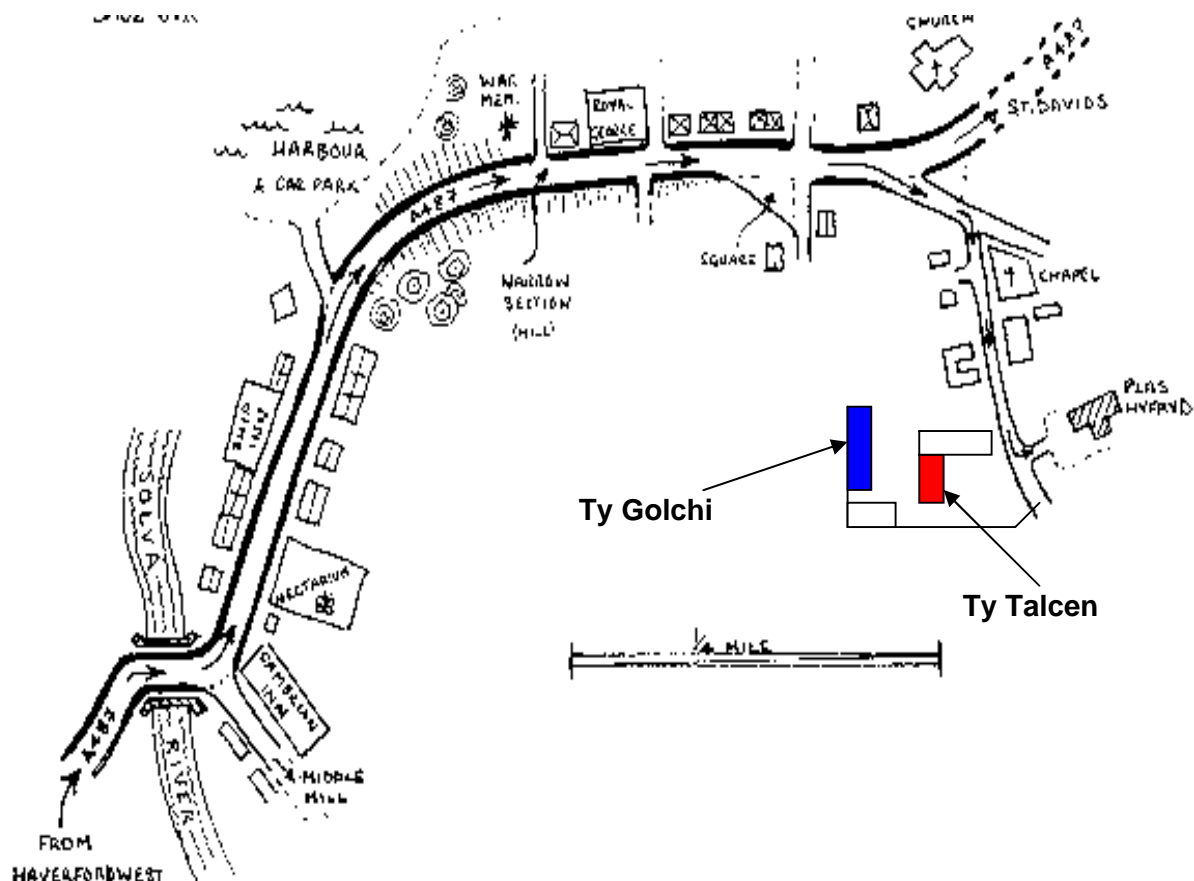
Take the M4 to it's end and continue on, following signs for Carmarthen (approx 15 miles). At Carmarthen continue on the road and at the second roundabout turn left onto A40, signposted to St Clears and Haverfordwest (approx 30 miles).

In Haverfordwest follow signs to St Davids on the A487.

Follow the A487 for approx 12 miles into SOLVA.

The A487 drops down into Solva village and crosses the river Solva. Follow the road up the other side of the valley and look for the Royal George Pub on your left. 100 metres after the Royal George you will see a small square (with parking) on your right. Approx 50 metres after this, a small road forks to the right (signed 'Whitchurch'). Take this road and then the next right (another 30 metres) which is a 90° turn, by the chapel.

Follow this road for about 120 metres, The entrance driveway is the last but one on the right side of Whitchuch road (entrance in stone wall opposite Plas Hyfryd). Ty GOLCHI is behind Ty Talcen (our other house)



### Directions from St David's

Enter the upper village – go past shop and slow at church then turn left back on yourself up a hill – Sign for Whitchurch. Bear right at the chapel and carry on up the hill past the white house on right. The entrance to Ty Golchi and Talcen is the NEXT RIGHT (25m past the white house). If the houses on the right run out then you have gone past it - there is a sign on the wall . Ty Talcen faces you as you drive in and Ty Golchi is the cottage behind – Park on the right near the garage

## This is an alternative set of directions on how to find Ty Golchi and Ty Talcen. Whitchurch Road Upper Solva SA62 6TR

I will assume that you have approached the village from the east – i.e. you have come through Haverfordwest and taken the A487 to St David's (Ty Dewi).

Once you have passed through Newgale, alongside the pebble beach (great surfing and lessons available) over the bridge, then up the big hill, some 3 miles further on you will reach Solva.

The village is split into two distinct halves, Lower Solva and Upper Solva.

Travelling from Newgale you come down a steep hill into the lower village with its brightly coloured houses, shops, pubs and restaurants. Following the road takes you up the hill, through a cut, past the Royal George on the left, and into Upper Solva.

200m past the Royal George there is a small car park on the right opposite the Memorial Hall, (nearest public telephone to Ty Golchi and Ty Talcen). Start to slow and indicate right.

A further 50m on, take the RIGHT FORK off the main road – signed Whitchurch – just before the church and the lay-by. (If you pass the local grocery shop on your right you have gone TOO FAR and will need to turn round!)

50 m up this road turn RIGHT at Mount Seion Chapel.

Carry on up the hill. You are getting close.....

There is a house painted white on the left and then one painted white on the right . Just past the 2<sup>nd</sup> white house there is a turning off the road to the RIGHT and this is the entrance to Ty Golchi and Ty Talcen (there is a sign on the wall just inside the entrance).

Straight ahead is a garage with a white door – park near the garage- but on the right (please leave 5 m clear so door can be opened for pedestrian access). The main entrance to Ty Golchi is down the steps from the gravel parking area – grey front door.

The property will be available from 16.30 on the day of your arrival and will be open. In order to fully prepare the house for the next party, **we ask that you vacate by 10.30 on departure day.** The key will be left inside..

I am sure that you will enjoy a trouble free holiday at Ty Golchi but if you do have any problems please call us on **07972 503561**

PLEASE NOTE that we take every care to ensure that cottages are clean and tidy ready for your arrival. In order for this to be achieved we would ask that tenants ALWAYS clean the cottage before departure and leave it in the same condition as found upon arrival, especially the kitchen and bathroom areas. It would also assist if you **take the pillow cases and duvet covers off the beds you have used.** Agencies often hold a deposit against cottages being left uncleaned. We do not, and with your help will avoid having to bring in this practice.
